UZMCAST, soon to be Marondera University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology (MUAUST), trains BSc in Agriculture Sciences and Technology (Crop and Animal Sciences). Students will specialize in Agronomy, Breeding, Horticulture, Animal Health, Animal Nutrition and Meat Sciences. Situated on a productive farm with various crop and livestock enterprises as well as support facilities including functional engineering workshop and laboratories with state of the art equipment, UZMCAST has the facilities for augmenting theoretical learning with practice in both the crop and animal sciences.

The breeding programme will cover, in addition to basic genetics and breeding courses, Molecular Breeding, Biotechnology, Seed Technology and Seed Business Management to produce holistic breeders and seed systems specialists. UZMCAST is working towards technologies that enable farmers to adapt to climate change induced and other



challenges. The breeding programme established during the 2015/16 season aims to develop climate ready drought resilient maize varieties with improved water and nutrient use efficiency for Zimbabwe and the Southern Africa region.

While still developing climate ready varieties, to support the seed technology effort, UZMCAST scientists are disseminating resource use efficient technologies including utilising drip irrigation, soil fertility improvement cultural practices and intensive land use supported with farmer training in agronomy, farm management and other farming aspects. UZMCAST is working closely with large and small scale commercial as well as small holder farmers surrounding the institution and around Zimbabwe to ensure technology developed through research reaches and benefits stakeholders.

UZMCAST is striving towards sustainable climate ready farming systems for better farming business, livelihoods and food security.

THE ARUSHA PROTOCOL FOR THE PROTECTION OF NEW VARIETIES OF PLANTS & REGULATIONS FOR ARUSHA PROTOCOL FOR THE PROTECTION OF NEW VARIETIES OF PLANTS

The Protocol was concluded in July 2015 but has not yet entered into force because ARIPO has not secured ratification or accession from the required minimum number of countries. If a variety is registered in one state this Plant Variety Protection System allows for protection in other ARIPO states/ countries if a breeder wishes.

The accompanying regulations are still under consideration. Plans are to have them finalised and have them signed onto by end of 2016.
